

Caring for People who Display Behavioural and Psychological Symptoms of Dementia

A Series of One-Day Workshops for Occupational Therapists in

BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND

The majority of people with dementia experience associated behavioural and psychological symptoms (BPSD) during the course of their illness. These symptoms which include aggression, agitation, psychosis, anxiety and depression are often the most distressing part of the disease for the person experiencing them and for those providing care. Non-pharmacological interventions are recommended as the first line in treating these symptoms. Occupational Therapists (OTs) have a unique theoretical foundation upon which effective practical interventions may be built. This series of one-day workshops aims to further develop skills that OTs can use in effectively managing BPSD in acute, sub acute, community and residential aged care settings.

Interactive learning methods, small group work, roles plays, case examples and practical exercises will be used throughout each workshop to explore and illustrate the workshop material discussed. Examples of interventions will be available during the workshops for OTs to interact with.

WORKSHOP 1 - 11/09/2015

Effectively Managing Behavioural and Psychological Symptoms of Dementia - Foundation Workshop

This workshop introduces OTs to an expanded PEO model which is used throughout the 4 workshops as a comprehensive foundation for the assessment and management of BPSD. The primary aetiological models used to understand and treat BPSD will be covered, in addition to an overview of current evidence for non-pharmacological interventions. OTs will be involved in completing an assessment and developing an individually tailored plan aimed at more effectively responding to the needs and abilities of those with dementia and their carers. Case examples will be used to throughout facilitate practical application and problem solving.

WORKSHOP 2 - 13/11/2015

Advanced Management of the Person with BPSD

This workshop builds further skills in the assessment and management of the person with BPSD including a more detailed look at BPSD assessment tools and the use of these tools in assessing intervention outcomes. OTs will also be introduced to the range of assessment tools used to assess the person with dementia and their carer. Participants will be involved in selecting appropriate assessment tools, interpreting assessment results and developing interventions that are responsive to the person with BPSD and reflective of their individual abilities, interests, preferences and routines.

WORKSHOP 3 - 10/6/2016

Advanced Management of BPSD using Occupational Approaches

This hands-on workshop builds further practical skills in the development and use of occupation approaches in managing BPSD and caring for the person with dementia. OTs will be provided with opportunities to take home individually tailored occupational orientated resources that can be used in BPSD management including reminiscence resources, sensory based resources and games.

WORKSHOP 4 - 29/7/2016

Advanced Management of BPSD using Environmental Approaches

This workshop provides a more detailed look at the current evidence for environmental interventions in BPSD management and builds further skills in the use of these approaches. OTs will be engaged in developing environmental strategies including completing simulated environmental modifications in response to given case studies. Participants will also develop skills in designing best practice dementia environments with particular focus on the use of cueing for improved functioning.
