Philanthropic Funding Opportunity – The Rebecca Cooper Foundation

Funding opportunity \$1,350,000 over 5 years!

The Rebecca L Cooper Medical Research Foundation is inviting applications for the 2024 Rebecca Cooper Fellowship. **Applications close 5pm, 31 August 2023**, for funding commencing January 2024.

Targeted at researchers who are 10-15 years post-doctoral, the fellowship provides a salary component of \$220,000 per year and a research support package of \$50,000 per year for a five-year term.

The Foundation is particularly committed to funding discovery research that will increase understanding of the biological mechanisms causing diseases within its nominated areas of medical research. The Foundation will also consider funding translational research that is clearly based on an understanding of disease mechanisms and biology and has the potential to change clinical practice for treating a disease or its symptoms in its nominated areas of research interests. Clinical research, such as cohort studies or clinical trials, will not be given a high funding priority.
