Update on Graduate Research Scholarships - Round 3 2023

Domestic Scholarships

- Number of domestic RTP scholarships available for 2023: 123 (12 reserved for strategic scholarships)
- Number of domestic RTP scholarships offered at the end of Round 3: 117 (6 strategic scholarships remain on hold)
- Number of domestic MRS scholarships for 2023: 7

Domestic scholarship cut-off score:

- **86.2** for <u>this round</u>
- Applicants between 85.8 and 86.1 have been waitlisted for any remaining RTP scholarships that may become
 available before Round 1 2024 and have been notified by email.
- The cut-off for unsuccessful applicants is scores of 85.8 and below. These applicants are being advised on a rolling basis.

International Scholarships

- Number of international scholarships available for 2023: 76
- Number of international scholarships offered at the end of Round 3: 76

International scholarship cut-off score:

- 89.5 for this round
- Applicants between 87.8 and 89.4 who did not receive an offer this round have been advised that they will automatically considered for Round 1 2024.
- The cut-off for unsuccessful applicants is scores of 87.7 and below. These applicants are being advised on a rolling basis
- Please note, the faculty received many high-scoring international applications in Round 3. Unfortunately, this meant
 the cut-off score for a scholarship to be awarded was raised from Round 2 to Round 3, not lowered as it has done in
 previous years.
