Application Form Checklist

Submissions are accepted in the form of a digital application which comprises of:

1. Application form

- Personal Details (name and contacts)
- Tertiary Qualifications
- Current Position and Employer
- Previous Position and Employer (within last 5 yrs)
- Civic, Education or Professional Association and Society memberships.

2. Details of Proposal (*must include a clear timeframe, maximum 1,000 words*)

3. Budget proposal (*up to 7 spending categories e.g. travel, accommodation, conference tickets, course tuition fees, etc.*)

4. Uploaded Supporting Documents

- Curriculum vitae or resumé
- Three written references (one must be the employer's recommendation)

References should typically be 1 page long and cover:

- Your professional capabilities and potential
 - The relevance of your proposed activity to your work and to maternal and child welfare
 - Your commitment to the field and to working in Victoria
 - Any other information the referee feels are relevant to your application
- The program course/conference outline of the proposed scholarship activity

Advice to applicants

The purpose of the Scholarship is to support the successful applicant to undertake further studies and/or research in Australia or overseas that will directly benefit children, their families and community within the field of health and education in Australia

Under the terms of the Trust deed, the scholarship is available to women only.

Selection criteria

Applications should clearly outline the work to be undertaken within the timeframe.

- the extent to which the applicant's proposal contributes to maternal and child welfare
